Definition

The YEFCS Newsletter is a document created by the EFCS to regularly deliver to its members the most relevant activities and plans of the EFCS and its official partners. We believe that, in parallel to all official e-mails and more traditional ways of contact, this newsletter will bring us even closer to our associates, while giving them a compilation of very valuable contents, in an informal, concise, reader-friendly, but nonetheless official and reliable way.

Structure

The YEFCS Newsletter will have an organized structure, a seasonal periodicity (see **Timeline**, below), and generally include the following 7 contents:

1) One message from 1 EFCS Council Board member to all EFCS associates and partners;

- 2) Information about future EFCS events (with names, locations, etc)
- 3) Information about future EFCS partners events (with names, locations, etc)

4) Educational content in the form of 1 multiple-choice question, provided by the EFCS Educational Committee

5) One message from 1 YEFCS member, targeted to all residents and young cytopathologists of our society members (ex: recommendation of a recent paper in cytology, thoughts on a major breakthrough, educational tools, opinion on a specific issue in cytology, etc)

- 6) Advertisement of a scientific journal
- 7) A Trivia section, where 1-2 historical or fun facts about Cytology

General Rules

The EFCS Residents and Young Pathologists Committee (ERYPC) will be in charge of organizing the contents of every YEFCS Newsletter, contacting contributors and providing the EFCS Editorial Board with a provisional version for consideration and approval in due time. All communication with external contributors must be made through the official e-mail address of the ERYPC.

No fees or costs whatsoever are involved (ie, neither the EFCS Council Board, nor any of the YEFCS Newsletter contributors will pay or be paid for the contents displayed on the Newsletter).

Contributors must provide a signed statement, before the release date of the Newsletter they contributed to, where they agree to be held fully accountable for any copyright infringement their contents may break.





We fully recommend all contributors to only use their own texts, upload images of their personal files and to correctly quote all references they decide to use.

Timeline

Step 1 - The ERYPC presents to the EFCS Editorial Board their proposals for contributors (points 1, 4 - after discussion with the EFCS Educational Committee - and 5), contents to be advertised (points 2, 3 and 6) and trivia (point 7) for all Newsletters of that year;

(Discussion)

Step 2 - The EFCS Editorial Board announces their final decision on the ERYPC proposals;

Step 3 – The ERYPC contacts all contributors, gathers their contributions, signed statements, creates the Proposed Final Versions of all Newsletters of that year and sends them to the Editorial Board, for their analysis and review;

(Discussion)

Step 4 – The EFCS Editorial Board announces their final decision on the Proposed Final Versions;

Step 5 - The Newsletters are then released throughout the year, preferentially in the following dates:

Spring Newsletter – March 21

Summer Newsletter – June 21

Fall Newsletter – Sep 21

Winter Newsletter – Dec 21
